



Certified Dietary Manager Program

The Certified Dietary Manager, Certified Food Protection Professional (CDM, CFPP) credential is now listed as the primary qualification for the Director of Food and Nutrition Services in the absence of a full-time dietitian.

The Dietary Manager Certificate Program offered by Passaic County Community College's Continuing Education Department provides comprehensive and convenient training.

What are the CMS LTC Regulations?

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) is the federal agency responsible for administering requirements governing long-term care facilities. In October 2016, CMS released a comprehensive update of the regulations to reflect advances in theory and practice of service, delivery, and safety for LTC residents, including a section newly defined as Food and Nutrition Services.

The CMS Final Rule specifies a staggered, three-phased implementation process for the regulatory provisions:

Program Details

- Students must complete 3 course modules focused on nutrition, safety and sanitation, and food production and management.
- Each module consists of 40 hours of coursework and 50 hours of supervised, on-site fieldwork.
- Students who successfully complete the program are eligible to take the ServSafe® exam.
- The Association of Nutrition & Foodservice Professionals (ANFP) is both the accrediting and certifying body for the training program.
